(*e*) Website www.madesimo.eu Immersed in greenery and bathed in sunlight, surrounded by peaks over 3,000 m and dotted with alpine lakes, Madesimo is the ideal place to spend your summer vacation.

The fresh, clean air is the perfect companion for a family picnic, a nature walk, or a more challenging hike.

The territory of Madesimo, with its hamlets and various alpine pastures, is unique to explore even by bike: from mountain bike trails to e-bike itineraries, from the climb to Passo Spluga to the descents in the Bike Park.

The possibilities to enjoy the mountains on foot, on two wheels,

and even on horseback are endless. And it doesn't stop there: Madesimo also offers the opportunity to engage in other sports, including golf and fishing.

A must-visit is the Valcava Alpine Garden, where you can fully appreciate the untouched beauty of the blooms and discover the beneficial properties of wild herbs.

In Madesimo, every leisure activity finds its expression, from fun to shopping, but everyone agrees on one thing: there is no better way to end the day than by savouring the local typical products at the table, which, at this altitude, are said to have an even more genuine flavour.

EASY WALKS AND NORDIC WALKING



RIVERSIDE WALK



A simple path exclusively for pedestrians, starting from the centre of Madesimo and reaching the valley floor along the Scalcoggia stream. The first section, up to the Dogana Vegia area, is paved, accessible for strollers, and lit at night. From here, following the sign for Passeggiata per Fondovalle – Tec dal Luzi, the route continues along a path through the meadows to the valley floor.

There are two picnic areas along the way equipped with barbecue grills, tables, and benches. To enjoy a meal in nature, you only need to bring firewood and clean up before leaving. For an outdoor workout, you can also use the various stations of the Fitness Trail, where you will find instructions on how to use the equipment and perform the exercises correctly.

THE FAIRY TALE PATH

Length: 850 m Elevation gain: 40 m

A true open-air fairy tale set in Madesimo, where each page is accessible on foot, even for the little ones, who are motivated by the curiosity to discover the story's ending. The story begins along the Scalcoggia stream, and the pages "turn" on the Andossi slope. This walking fairy tale is marked along the way by illustrated panels that reveal the entire story, bit by bit.

ANDOSSI WALK



The walk begins by following the Scalcoggia stream, crosses the Roman bridge, takes the path that ascends to the left, and winds along the Andossi cycling path. On the Andossi limestone plateau, you will find alpine pastures, groups of huts, the charming San Rocco chapel, La Baitella refreshment stop, and the Mai Tardi Refuge. Upon reaching the Mottaccio/La Baitella area, you can continue on the descent back to Madesimo, in the Scalcoggia area, near the tunnel (this last section is not passable with a stroller).

THE GROPPERA WATERFALL

In a picturesque spot just a few steps from the village is the Groppera Waterfall, fed by the stream of the same name. To reach it one starts from Piazza Bertacchi – also known as Piazza della Chiesa – following Via Cascata or Via Groppera. On arrival, the sight of this natural monument stirs the visitor's emotions.

THE DARK FOREST



A walk that starts near the Groppera Waterfall and winds through the *"dark forest"*, where friendly elves hide among the larches and berry plants.

GYPSUM QUARRY PATH



Length: 1 km Elevation gain: 55 m

A light, family-friendly walk that winds through the "La Sorgente" area. Along the route, there are 7 illustrative panels presenting the natural mountain environments, featuring alpine flora and fauna.

GOLF WALK

Length: 1.2 km Elevation gain: 105 m

The walk starts in the Arlecchino area, ascends and continues along the slope to the golf course. From here, you can enjoy a beautiful panorama of Madesimo. The path ends by connecting to the valley road. As it is paved with compacted gravel and features steps in some sections, the walk is not accessible to strollers.

CIRCULAR ROUTE: MADESIMO > MOTTA > LAGO AZZURRO > ALPE GROPPERA > ALPE PIANELLO



Length: 7.66 km Elevation gain: 377 m

The walk starts at the beginning of Via per Motta and ascends to Motta, a hamlet of Campodolcino, at 1,720 m altitude. There are two options to reach it: either via the paved road or through a beautiful larch forest along the *Chapel Path.* Once in Motta, the well-marked route continues to Lake Azzurro, a charming alpine lake fed by a natural underground spring that fills in spring and empties in autumn. From here, the route crosses the slope to Alpe Groppera (1,908 m above sea level), descends to Alpe Pianello (1,743 m above sea level), and returns to Madesimo via Via Emet. In Motta Alta, you can take a dirt road to the statue of Our Lady of Europe, 13 m high and gilded, offering a panoramic view of the entire Spluga Valley and the peaks of the Lepontine and Rhaetian Alps.

CABLE CAR MADESIMO – LARICI

With the cable car, which starts in the pedestrian heart of Madesimo, you can reach the 1,878 m of Alpe Groppera in just a few minutes. Pedestrians, bikers, strollers, and four-legged friends: there is room for everyone! Dates, opening hours, and prices: www.skiareavalchiavenna.it

OLD ROAD TO PIANAZZO

Length: 1.3 km Elevation gain: 150 m

The walk leads from Madesimo to the hamlet of Pianazzo (1,400 m above sea level) along the old road, which is now exclusively for pedestrians and bikes. Along the way, you can admire two waterfalls, both fed by the Scalcoggia stream: the *Catino Waterfall*, named for the shape of the rock sculpted by water erosion, and the *Pianazzo Waterfall*, which, with its 180-meter drop, is the highest in the Spluga Valley. The viewpoint over the waterfall is a striking endpoint for the walk.

CARDUCCI ITINERARY



A walk through history and culture via the poems of Carducci, who spent many summers in Madesimo from 1888 to 1905. In the places he most frequented during his stays here, there are about a dozen panels enriched with historical texts and verses written by the poet. Carducci's connection to Madesimo was so profound that in 1901 he was granted honorary citizenship.

DISCOVERING MAGICAL SPACES



This is not a defined itinerary but rather many enchanting spots to discover, scattered throughout the Spluga Valley. These are scenic glimpses worth admiring and capturing. The magical spaces are the frames to these corners to discover: small eco-friendly wooden windows that frame points of interest or panoramic views that have always been appreciated, such as Pizzo Spadolazzo, the Groppera and Pianazzo waterfalls, the Montespluga dam, the Portarezza chapel, the Roman bridge, and the Mottala lake. These are privileged observation points that also provide visitors with additional information.

ISOLA > CA' RASERI > CASCATA DELLA VAL FEBBRARO

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Length: 2.5 km circa Elevation gain: 297 m

The path to reach the Val Febbraro Waterfall starts from the hamlet of Isola (1,268 m) following trail C29 through the pastures that overlook the small village, reaching Ca' Raseri with its "carden," a typical rural construction found throughout the alpine valleys of Valchiavenna. From here, the route continues on an easy dirt road along the Febbraro stream until reaching the waterfall, partly hidden among a lush forest of fir trees. For families with strollers or those who prefer less elevation gain, a daily pass can be purchased to use the paved consortium road up to Ca' Raseri.

NORDIC WALKING

Nordic Walking is an activity that allows you to use about 90% of your muscles, as it involves more than just walking! This discipline cares for the entire body (and mind): it improves posture, works on full mobility that preserves joints, enhances coordination, and relieves accumulated stress. It is a moment to take care of yourself, achieve a psychophysical balance, immerse yourself in the enveloping alpine scenery, breathe pure air, and even enjoy a moment of relaxation at one of the valley's rest stops.

Due to the characteristics of the paths and the technique, it is suitable for everyone, and in the Madesimo area, the walk along the Scalcoggia stream, the Madesimo valley floor, and the Andossi plateau are excellent locations to discover this discipline.

MADESIMO > LAGO D'EMET E RIFUGIO BERTACCHI > PASSO DI NIEMET C6 C12 > N595

Elevation gain: 638 m Duration: about 2 hours

The itinerary starts from the hamlet of Macolini (1,656 m), north of Madesimo, crosses the stream, and continues along the plain formed by the Scalcoggia. On the right, the path ascends in switchbacks, then climbs a ridge to reach the Bertacchi Refuge by Lake Emet, at an altitude of 2,192 m. Skirting the lake on the left, the route continues to the Niemet Pass at 2,294 m, where the boundary marker between Italy and Switzerland is located.

MONTESPLUGA > LAGO D'EMET



Elevation gain: 264 m Duration: about 1 hour and 30 minutes

The hike starts from Stuetta and follows the state road along Lake Montespluga. On the right, after about 1 km, there is a dirt road that gradually ascends through the pastures toward the Andossi ridge, leaving Montespluga behind. The route continues through a wide glacial valley with flat sections alternating with short climbs, dominated by Pizzo Spadolazzo from above. Finally, you reach the beautiful Lake Emet and its huts, where the Giovanni Bertacchi Refuge stands in a panoramic position. From here, you can continue to the Niemet Pass or descend to Madesimo.

MONTESPLUGA > LAGO NERO

Elevation gain: 402 m Duration: approximately 1 hour

Upon entering the dirt road near the viaduct that runs alongside part of Lake Montespluga, the path begins, climbing directly up the pasture. Following a long diagonal in the direction of the Suretta waterfalls, you then turn right until reaching a small structure. From here, the route continues along the edge of the slope that forms the basin of Lago Nero at 2,310 m.

MADESIMO > ALPE ANGELOGA

Elevation gain: 494 m Duration: approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes

The excursion starts from Madesimo, ascending to the settlement of Motta Bassa and then continuing through the woods to the huts of Motta Alta, near Lake Azzurro (1,850 m). Crossing the pastures southwards and passing the Statue of Our Lady of Europe on the right, you reach the Valley of Fraciscio where the path ascends along the slope to the left. The route crosses steep slopes with relatively easy rocky outcrops. Along the way, you will encounter two channels that descend towards the Rabbiosa stream and the remains of an old cableway. The destination is Alpe Angeloga (2,044 m), which hosts the Chiavenna Refuge in its basin.

ISOLA > GOLA DEL CARDINELLO > MONTESPLUGA



Elevation gain: 637 m Duration: approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes

The Gola del Cardinello gets its name from the nearby Monte Cardine, which was once one of the most important routes to Northern Europe. It is famous for its path carved into the sheer side of the valley, with some sections featuring steps cut into the rock.

Starting from Isola, at an altitude of 1,268 meters, the route initially ascends on the right side of the valley, passing through the hamlets of Mottaletta and Rasdeglia. The ascent continues until the road narrows into a path

and climbs a bit further before following the cliff face above the stream: a ledge carved into the rock that ascends slowly over a stretch of more than 500 meters, eventually emerging at Stuetta, below the Montespluga dam. Once at the top, you can continue to the village of Montespluga. After a well-deserved rest, you can either descend back through the gorge, cross the Andossi plateau to reach Madesimo, or use public transport to return to Isola.

WEATHER AND WEBCAM

To check the real-time weather situation, Madesimo not only has webcams but also hosts a weather station from the Lombardy Weather Centre. www.centrometeolombardo.com

VALTELLINA OUTDOOR

When organizing excursions, planning is essential. www.valtellinaoutdoor.it is the site that allows users to discover the itineraries of Valtellina and Valchiavenna.

The **website** and its connected **app** enable you to download the trails and have them with you during your hikes. The portal is interactive and allows users to plan itineraries or review the route just taken, calculating the technical data as well.

Elevation gain: 1,280 m Duration: approximately 6 hours

The first part of the hike follows the itinerary from Alpe Macolini to Lake Emet, then continues towards the Niemet Pass. From there, it ascends the slopes on the right and follows the Italian-Swiss border towards Pizzo Emet. After the first stretch of scree, the path moves to the right and enters the centre of the valley, climbing up to a noticeable notch on the right. Once at Colle dell'Emet at 2,850 m, it descends 50 m to the south before climbing another notch, the Sterla Pass, which opens onto the Rebella Valley. Following it to the Val di Lei Lake and then taking the dirt road of the dam to the north, you will quickly reach the Baita del Capriolo.

MONTESPLUGA > BIVACCO DEL SURETTA > LAGHI AZZURRI / PIZZO CASA / PASSO SPLUGA



Elevation gain: 840 m Duration: approximately 3 hours

The path starts from Lake Montespluga on grassy ledges, then crosses some streams and scree until reaching the Suretta bivouac, located at the foot of the glacier of the same name. From here, you can continue to some beautiful small lakes: Lake Beergseeli in Swiss territory, where you can admire Pizzo Tambò (3,279 m), Lake Azzurro, and Lake Ghiacciato. For those with energy left, you can also head towards Pizzo Casa, which offers one of the most beautiful views of the upper Spluga Valley.

MONTESPLUGA > BIVACCO VAL LOGA

Elevation gain: 865 m Duration: approximately 3 hours

First built in 1978 and recently renovated, the Val Loga Bivouac can be reached from the Montespluga plain via a path that requires a decent level of technical preparation. The first section traverses the gentle pastures crisscrossed by a series of streams, then climbs steeply in switchbacks where the vegetation increasingly gives way to rocks. The bivouac can also be reached from the Val Schisarolo, an alternative for the return to the valley, thus creating a sort of loop around Monte Cardine.

ISOLA > VAL FEBBRARO > PASSO BALDISCIO

Elevation gain: 1,085 m Duration: approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes

The itinerary winds through the valley above the village of Isola, a valley rich in "carden" and historically a land of smuggling. The first part of the route climbs steeply through the meadows before transitioning to a gentler gradient in the valley after the hamlet of Ca' Raseri. Here, the path widens into a dirt road through the woods, flanking the stream fed by the overlying alpine lakes and the Val Febbraro Waterfall. The hike ends after passing the Lago Grande and Laghetto del Mot at Passo Baldiscio (2,350 m), marking the border with Val Mesolcina (Switzerland).

For those seeking a simpler hike, you can reach Val Febbraro from Isola by purchasing a pass to drive to Ca' Raseri, then continue on foot to

the beautiful waterfall, or drive to Borghetto and then proceed on foot.

TRAIL RUNNING

Endurance, strength, and, during competitions, speed. From 1,200 m to over 3,000 m, enthusiasts of this discipline have a wide range of options in the Upper Spluga Valley. The peaks surrounding Madesimo, the length of the routes with significant positive and negative elevation gains, and the varied surfaces provide an excellent training ground for high-altitude runners


MEDIUM MOUNTAIN GUIDES

TREKKING VALLESPLUGA

A hike that includes 8 stages, aiming to traverse the entire Spluga Valley at altitude. This route allows for a complete experience and a comprehensive view of the alpine environment of the valley, with trails that develop at an average altitude of 2,400 meters. The start and end points are bivouacs or refuges: 1. San Bernardo > Rifugio Carlo Emilio 2. Rifugio Carlo Emilio > Bivacco Ca' Bianca 3. Bivacco Ca' Bianca > Bivacco Val Loga 4. Bivacco Val Loga > Bivacco Val Loga 4. Sivacco Suretta > Rifugio Bertacchi 5. Rifugio Bertacchi > Rifugio Chiavenna 7. Rifugio Chiavenna > Bivacco Chiara e Walter 8. Bivacco Chiara e Walter > San Giacomo Filippo


From Switzerland to Italy: the viaSpluga is based on the paths travelled 2000 years ago by pilgrims and merchants. A walking experience that marked the extraordinary Grand Tour for many European intellectuals and artists. A different way to holiday, combining wellness, nature, sports, and culture. The viaSpluga is a hiking and cultural trail in the Central Alps that has connected Thusis and Chiavenna for centuries, bridging the Grisons, Rhaeto-Romance, Walser, and Lombard cultures. Most of the viaSpluga winds along mule tracks, where the original structure is largely maintained or restored.

The itinerary not only brings you face to face with history but also introduces you to unique mountain landscapes and local populations whose lives have been shaped by the traffic surrounding the pass.

The viaSpluga is a total of 70 km. Starting from Thusis (720 m), it passes through the famous Viamala gorge to Splügen (1,457 m). From the village, it heads south, ascending to the 2,115 m of the Spluga Pass, the highest point of the route. From here, it descends, crossing the entire Spluga Valley to 333 m in Chiavenna.

VIE DEI CARDEN AND VIA ALPINA

VIE DEI CARDEN

The "Carden Routes" are itineraries where you can closely appreciate the splendid and ancient constructions known as carden[,] characteristic structures found in the territories of Val San Giacomo, Bregaglia, and Mesolcina. These are ancient constructions, made of wood and stone, symbolizing an entire valley, which have transformed the slopes of our mountains, enriching the pastures with history and tradition. Used as homes, barns, or stables, carden are characteristic of the entire alpine arc but vary by area based on the type of wood and construction techniques used. A sort of spontaneous bio-architecture, as only the materials the territory offered were used: stone for the uphill side, wood for the downhill side. In Campodolcino, at the Mu.Vi.S., a carden from 1727 from the locality of Mottaletta has been partially reconstructed.



VIA ALPINA

A network of 5 hiking routes through the 8 countries of the alpine arc, over 5,000 km and 342 daily stages. The mountains of the Spluga Valley are part of the red itinerary in the section Pian San Giacomo (CH) – Passo del Baldiscio – Isola – Gola del Cardinello – Montespluga Dam – Lake Emet – Niemet Pass – Innerferrera (CH). www.via-alpina.org



Mu.Vi.S.

The Museo della Via Spluga and the Val San Giacomo features an exhibition path that testifies to the valley's civilization and its international role held for centuries.

On the ground floor, in the former sacristy, there is a ticket office and bookshop with a series of local books. Visitors can receive various types of information: tourist and historical. The staff will be happy to help you get to know and use the territory consciously, proposing cultural routes and itineraries.

The Mu.Vi.S. offers visitors access to its specialist mountain library and archive, which holds a rich collection of vintage postcards and various interesting documents.

The Mu.Vi.S. is also home to the Ecomuseo Valle Spluga and its Centre for Documentation and Interpretation of Local Historical Memory.

It's morning, and while you let your dreams settle into the folds of your pillow, the coffee pot is already bubbling in the kitchen. The table hints that it will indeed be a great day: steaming coffee, rustic bread waiting to host a generous layer of soft **alpine butter**, and then... a dive into a sea of wild **blueberries**. Because you can dive here too, in the Italian municipality farthest from the sea!

Only here, however, do the bees breakfast on the nectar of the rich alpine blooms, and from their fragrant feast, we all benefit by enjoying the exceptional honey that patient beekeepers harvest. A little further on the table, which increasingly resembles a masterpiece, a red spot catches your eye: **strawberries** and **raspberries** grown at 1300 meters, healthy, genuine, and delicious!

Head out for a long walk, with fresh air opening your thoughts. You feel so good you wish time would stand still. Everything around you is harmonious. Suddenly your senses are teased by a note that smells of a lit fireplace, a slow rhythm, **meat**, and **vegetables** dancing on the **"piota"** (stone slab). You can't miss this dance. Tasty **ribs** are accompanied by golden, soft **polenta** and the delicious **Starleggia potatoes**, appreciated by everyone for their exquisite flavour and even for their recognized antioxidant properties.

The dance continues with the entry of a rich selection of **alpine cheeses**, from **Montespluga** to **Bitto Dop**, also used to make **gnocchetti** from Valchiavenna and Valtellinese pizzoccheri. Valtellinese too is that glass of wine that refreshes your palate and prepares



you for the final dance: a slow waltz with the typical **Madesimo cake**, with its unmistakable scent of buckwheat and blueberries.

You bid farewell to the dancing show, but the day has more surprises in store for you. After an afternoon of sports, fun, and shopping, just as the sun starts to play hide and seek, the moment is right for a good aperitif. This time the opening notes are those of the **goat** violin, which, resting on the shoulder like a real violin, is sliced by wielding the knife like a bow. But the undisputed queen remains the brisaola - with the "i" - different from the Valtellinese bresaola not only for the vowel but because its preparation also includes mountain herbs, aromas, wine, and the wind of the Valchiavenna cellars – the "sorèl". Always good - like its younger sister, the slinzega alone or accompanied by "sciatt," mushrooms, and **rve bread**. Twilight is also the best time to taste the excellent craft beers from local producers. Strictly chilled.

The day can only end with one last little escape, the goodnight treat: a taste of the best local **spirits**, witnesses of a never-forgotten past, where families in the Spluga Valley produced grappa and spirits using **herbs**, **spices**, **plants**, **berries**, and **roots**. The **edible herbs** that grow in the area have many beneficial properties: so why not prepare yourself a warm and therapeutic herbal tea? It's the last indulgence of the evening before you surrender to Morpheus' embrace. And they will undoubtedly be golden dreams.

MADESIMO BOTANICAL



VALCAVA ALPINE GARDEN

An amphitheatre located in the central part of the Andossi, between 1600 and 1900 meters, hosts the garden named after a splendid gorge carved here. On the side facing the village, it is rugged and wooded at the lower part, with meadows at the top, where it opens to dominate the horizon of the mountains of the entire upper valley.

It is easily reachable on foot from Madesimo, following the walk along the Scalcoggia River, or by car to the Andossi area.

The biodiversity in Valcava is very high. The garden includes a variety of different habitats, 11 of which have been identified, and it contains a sample of the entire flora present in the upper valley. Here, the endemic vegetation is maintained in the most natural conditions possible: around 200 species have been catalogued, 17 of which are considered rare.

Visitors are guided through a network of paths in the various microenvironments, illustrated by explanatory panels that deepen the knowledge of individual species, largely visualized on signs along the routes. Two wooden structures characterize the garden, one intended as a service and rest area, the other built according to the ancient carden technique, used as a storage for old farming tools and for forest exploitation.

The Valcava Alpine Carden is open all year round and at all hours, but the best periods to visit are May, with the most beautiful blooms, and September, when the mountain offers the last flowers and presents the most intense lights and colours of the year.

COLLECTION

MUSHROOMS

Collection is allowed every day, from dawn to dusk, exclusively by hand, without the use of any auxiliary tools, with a maximum daily collection limit of 3 kg per person, except for a single specimen of greater weight. It is mandatory to perform a preliminary cleaning at the collection site, and transport must be in rigid containers suitable for spore dispersion.

MEDICINAL HERBS

Collection is allowed with prior authorization, up to a maximum daily limit of 50 specimens per person.

BLUEBERRIES

Collection is allowed exclusively by hand, without the use of any auxiliary tools, with a maximum daily limit of 1 kg per person. If blueberries are collected by a group, the maximum daily limit allowed is 4 kg.

WILD FLORA

Collection is allowed – excluding protected species – with a maximum limit of 6 specimens per species of flower and strictly without uprooting the roots.

THE MONTESPLUGA DAM

A new feature of the Montespluga area is the path leading to the small village of Montespluga and the last steep hairpin bends that climb up to the Spluga Pass along the SS36 and the Montespluga dam. The backdrop is the peaks of the upper Spluga Valley: Pizzo Ferrè, Pizzo Tambò, and the Suretta group.

ALPE GROPPERA LOOP

This cycling route is suitable for everyone, especially as a first bicycle outing or for those with limited time. The route develops in the woods above Madesimo, on the eastern side where skiers tackle the ski slopes in winter.

ANDOSSI LOOP

The route winds along beautiful white dirt roads in a loop in the northern Andossi area, starting and ending in Madesimo. The panorama is unrivalled, offering splendid views of the peaks of the Spluga Valley: Pizzi Stella, Groppera, Emet, Suretta, Tambò, Ferrè, and Quadro.

FROM MADESIMO TO RASDEGLIA

The route starts from Madesimo and arrives at the hamlet of Isola, from where you can continue to Rasdeglia by following the road (2 km) or venturing into the small nucleus of Mottaletta. You find yourself at the foot of the Cardinello Gorges, a spectacular deep gorge travelled since ancient times.

FROM ISOLA TO ALPE FRONDAGLIO

The route starts in the hamlet of Isola, where there are interesting historical sites and the parish church dedicated to Saints George and Martin, with an exhibition of sacred works. Climbing towards the alpine pastures, you can enjoy an incomparable peace and relaxing silence. Along the way, you will encounter the settlements of Canto with its carden, typical rural alpine valley constructions made of wood and stone, until reaching Alpe Frondaglio. The panorama here is postcard-worthy, and you are at the foot of Pian dei Cavalli, one of the most beautiful and well-known naturalistic and historical places in the area. Making a short detour into Val Febbraro, you also reach the foot of the waterfall of the same name.

FROM ISOLA TO ALPE BORGHETTO

The route starts from Isola and leads to the Borghetto alpine pasture (1,897 m) in Val Febbraro, located on the edge of a grassy terrace. The valley crossed by this route ends at Passo Baldiscio (2,350 m), marking the border with Val Mesolcina (Switzerland), a land of smuggling in the past. It's worth replicating the route in autumn, a season in which the larch foliage is particularly appreciated: a spectacle to admire and photograph.

PIAN DEI CAVALLI LOOP

The loop route to Pian dei Cavalli, a wide and bright plateau among the most beautiful places in the Spluga Valley, is a bicycle route following in the footsteps of ancient Mesolithic hunters.

The route develops on different road surfaces from Isola to Val Febbraro, climbing to Frondaglio and passing through Pian dei Cavalli, Lago Bianco, and then descending towards the San Sisto basin. A fairly challenging loop, but full of panoramas and corners to admire.

FROM CHIAVENNA TO PASSO SPLUGA

The route starts from Chiavenna (333 m) and follows the state road to the Spluga Pass (2,115 m). Leaving the heart of the town of Chiavenna, the route immediately climbs and continues uphill. flanking the Liro stream and passing through the villages of San Giacomo Filippo, Gallivaggio – with the sanctuary dedicated to the apparition of the Madonna in 1492 - Lirone, and Cimaganda. Campodolcino welcomes you with a flat stretch of road, before tackling the historic 10 hairpin bends. that lead to Pianazzo, offering the opportunity to admire the highest waterfall in Valchiavenna. Continuing, you encounter more hairpin bends and the Andossi tunnels that lead to higher altitudes and offer a beautiful panorama of the entire upper Spluga Valley. Finally, you reach the artificial lake of Montespluga, the village of the same name, and the last steep hairpin bends that climb up to the Spluga Pass.



CAMPODOLCINO

Distance from Madesimo: 6 km

Campodolcino is a village rich in history, symbolized by the Roman bridge over the Rabbiosa stream, which flows through the "caurga," a deep gorge carved between the walls and recognized as a national natural monument. It is a stop on the ancient Via Spluga, evidenced by the **Via Spluga Museum** located in the historic "Palàzz," which preserves documents and memories of the valley, as well as in the Church of St. John the Baptist, dating back to 1500. Ascending to **Motta**, you can find the gold-plated statue of Our Lady of Europe, at the base of which is the sanctuary of the same name.

In **Fraciscio**, you can visit the birthplace of Saint Luigi Guanella, founder of the Guanellian order, and the Cà Bardassa, a typical rural house built starting in the 1700s.

Campodolcino is also the starting point for numerous trekking and bike trails, which lead to small typical villages such as **San Sisto**, **Bondeno**, or **Gualdera**, where you will find the new Spluga Park Adventure, an adventure park suitable for all ages.

A new addition for summer 2024 is the **Tibetan bridge** that crosses the Rabbiosa, starting before reaching Fraciscio.

CHIAVENNA AND SURROUNDINGS

Distance from Madesimo: 20 km

Chiavenna, a Slow City and Orange Flag of the Italian Touring Club, with its ancient heart and characteristic streets, is the perfect destination for an excursion.

The visit can start at the **San Lorenzo** complex, where you can admire the **Baptistery** and the adjoining **Treasury Museum**, and then continue through history by exploring the alleys and squares of the historic centre and visiting the **Paradiso Botanical Archaeological Park**.

In the locality of Pratogiano, you will find the highest concentration of "crotti," an excellent choice for a typical lunch. In the afternoon, you can take the bike path to reach **Piuro**, with Palazzo Vertemate Franchi, a fascinating 16th-century residence, and the Acquafraggia waterfalls for a rest on the grass. For those who love walking and getting lost in the woods, the Marmitte dei Giganti Nature **Reserve** is recommended, while for admiring the panorama from above. Pianazzola. Savogno, and Uschione are ancient nuclei where time seems to have stopped. In lower Valchiavenna on the shores of Lake Mezzola vou will find the charming **Tempietto di San** Fedelino and the Pian di Spagna Nature Reserve.

VAL DI LEI E SVIZZERA

SPLÜGEN > Distance from Madesimo: 21 km ST. MORITZ > Distance from Madesimo: 67 km

Crossing the border, you can reach **Val di Lei** by car, an Italian valley - located in the municipality of Piuro - but its dam belongs to Swiss territory. Val di Lei is connected to adjacent valleys by some trails and can therefore also be reached on foot: an opportunity to seize. The large dam is a masterpiece built by Italian engineers and workers; the valley is ideal for hiking and biking, fishing, and wildlife observation.

Crossing the Spluga, the first Swiss village beyond the border is **Splügen**, with sunburned wooden Walser houses. It's no surprise that it is one of the oldest and most characteristic villages in the Canton of Graubünden.

To the south and Ticino, the village of **Nufenen** with the Walserama exhibition, the **Mesolcina**, the **San Bernardino Pass** area, and **Bellinzona** with its UNESCO heritage castles are worth a visit.

Following the road towards Val di Lei, you can take a short detour to **Juf**, the highest settlement in Europe, at 2100 m, inhabited all year round.

The **Viamala Corge**, an impressive natural monument with walls up to 300 meters high, has fascinated tourists for centuries.


Not least are the villages of **Andeer**, **Zillis**, and the city of **Chur**.

In the Canton of Graubünden, we also find the **Engadine**, also called the "Living Room of the Alps," for its mineral springs and particularly pleasant climate throughout the year. Several languages are spoken here, including Romansh, German, Italian, and French. **Piz Bernina** is the only peak in the Eastern

Alps exceeding 4000 m. Among the most wellknown mountains are **Piz Palu**, **Corvatsch**, **Corviglia**, and **Diavolezza**.

St. Moritz is the pearl of the Engadine, and the Bernina Express – part of the UNESCO World Heritage – allows visitors to travel to Tirano (Valtellina) to enjoy unique landscapes, including the picturesque alpine panorama and crystal-clear lakes with a magical light that makes one fall in love with the landscape.
